Agriculture

True mixed farms are now moving more to either farming or ranching as owners become more efficient at these disciplines. Grain production accounts for a percentage of land use with wheat being the main field crop in the area. Other common grains include canola, flax, barley and oats. In addition to traditional cattle operations, modern hog operations also contribute to the agricultural diversity in the region.



Oil and Gas

With shallow gas and pockets of oil prevalent through the area, the oil and gas industry is one of the main drivers of the economy of Special Areas No. 2. Highway 36, a high load corridor, leads to major oil and gas developments in the oil sands. Additionally, major and secondary paved highways supplement the area. Our region is ideally situated for oil and gas industry transportation and servicing.



Power Generation & Mining

Due to thermal coal being one of the abundant natural resources, power generation and mining account for significant employment in the region. Water is pumped from the Red Deer River into a cooling pond to provide water for the Sheerness Generating Station. The cooling pond is also a source of water for surrounding communities, irrigation water for regional farmers and also a valued recreation area for residents.



Transportation

Special Areas No 2 is located in Southeast Alberta and the main east-west route in the region is Highway 9, which is part of Alberta's high load corridor. The main north-south route is Highway 36. These highways are primary provincial routes for trucking and transport. Hanna Municipal Airport has a 3,500 foot runway, and the nearest commercial and air freight services are at Calgary International Airport.
